

Cold Lake Indigenous Education Award

Support for Indigenous students from the Cold Lake area in college or university.

Since 1994, Imperial's Cold Lake Operations has offered education awards to help Indigenous students pay for school. If you're going into a diploma or degree program, you may be eligible.



Candy, Cold Lake

What's offered?

- Up to \$2,500 per year while you're in school
- You can receive the award for up to four years
- Helps with school costs like tuition, books, and supplies



Who can apply?

To be eligible, you:

- Have a high school diploma or General Education Development (GED)/Canadian Adult Education Credential (CAEC)
- Have been accepted into college or university in a program with skills usable in the energy industry
- Must be a member of one of these Indigenous communities:

You must also include proof of Indigenous community citizenship/membership in the application.

Good to know

- Awards are paid out after you've attended school for one month
- Priority may be given to recent high school graduates
