



# Indigenous internship program

## Description of the program

Since 1998, Imperial’s Cold Lake operation provides paid on-the-job training for Indigenous people for up to two years, with graduates gaining valuable experience working at our operations.

Depending on the trades-related position, a successful intern must be committed to obtaining a 4th Class or 3rd Class Power Engineering Certificate, Millwright Journeyman Ticket or an Instrumentation/Electrical Ticket. Positions are also available within the business support group office administration.

The program is up to a one year paid internship with possibility of a one year extension. Upon successful completion of the second year there is a possibility for an offer of full-time employment.

## Eligibility requirements

1. To be eligible, candidates must be a member of one of the following communities:

- Cold Lake First Nations
- Frog Lake First Nation

- Onion Lake Cree Nation

- Elizabeth Métis Settlement
- Fishing Lake Métis Settlement

2. Must have Grade 12 diploma or G.E.D.
3. May be required to hold a valid driver’s licence and provide a driver’s abstract.

- Plant operator
- Millwright
- Instrumentation/electrical technician
- Business support group (office administration)
- Environmental technician

## Application process

Candidates submitting applications must include a copy of Indigenous community membership.

For applicants selected to be interviewed, pre-employment background screening will be required which will include a driver’s abstract covering the last five years (dated within six months of application).
